“CUO propagates Euphrates project under Erasmus Mundus programme”

The Euphrates project is a unique and important International level programme for Higher education in the European countries conducted under the Erasmus Mundus Programme which is an outcome of joint collaboration between European Union and Indian Nation. Eleven Universities of India have participated as partners in the program along with 12 European Universities and Central University of Orissa is one of them. The project was initiated by former Vice Chancellor of CUO, Prof. Surabhi Banerjee in 2013 and is propagated by Dr. Kakoli Banerjee, Asst. Professor CBCNR now. It is a matter of great pride and an important academic achievement for an upcoming university like CUO. The Central University of Orissa (CUO), Koraput launched the second call of the Euphrates project under Erasmus Mundus programme from 24th Nov, 2014 to 11th Jan, 2015 for the students and staffs of CUO on 3rd December 2014 at its Landiguda campus in Koraput.

The programme started off with the lighting of the lamp by the dignitaries on the dias which included Prof. M.
